i want to thank everyone who made it possible for me to go to park, and i pray that my next four years will be the same, if not better.

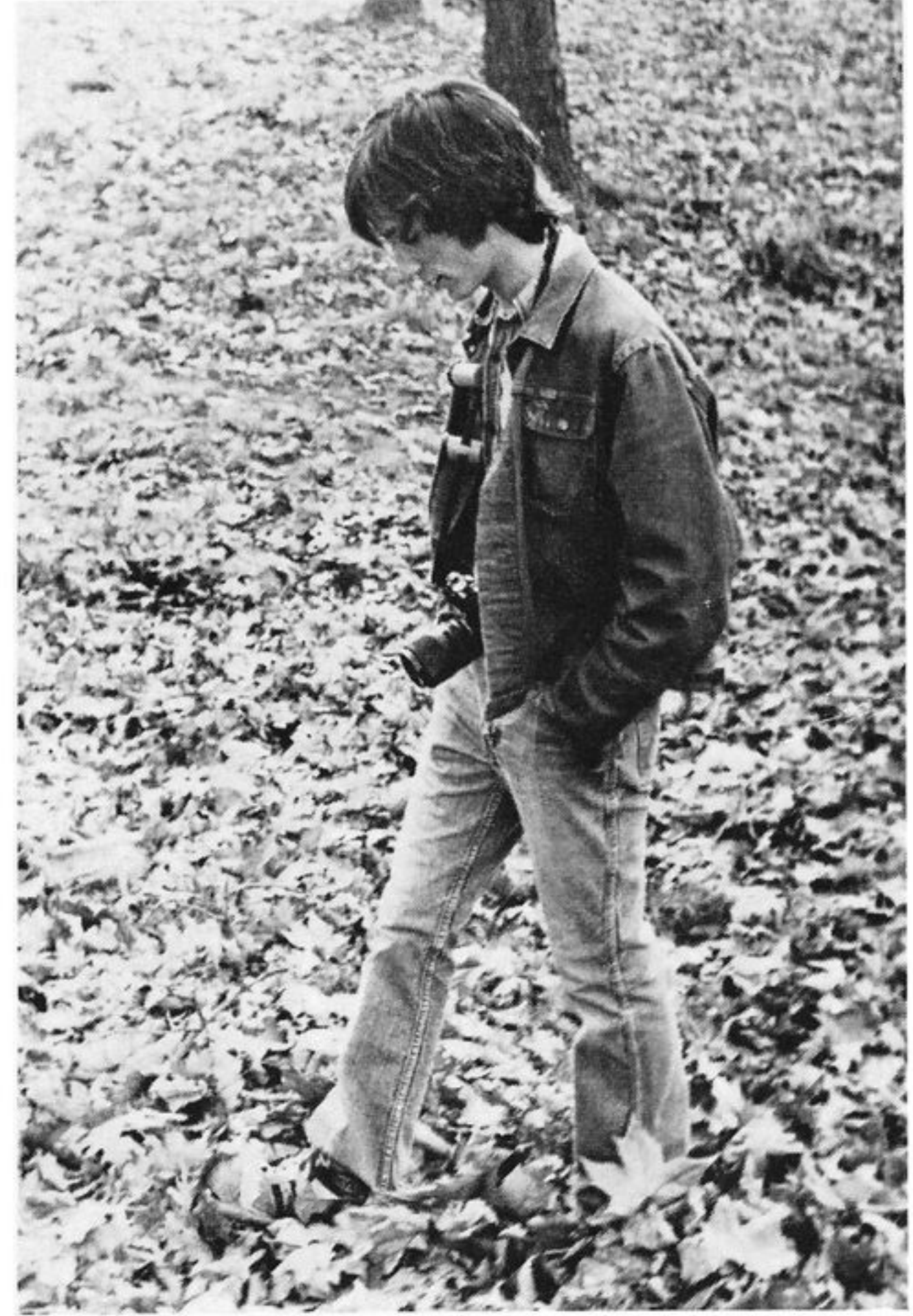
